A. ATTICA

Central Athens

Agora – Areopagus

“Tholos cemetery” (Plan 1)

1 G 12 : 4 (Grave 4)

Inside pit cut in the bedrock, set on its side: *Neck-amphora*, wheelmade, P 4613 (H. 0.417m; Diam. max. 0.292m, Diam. foot 0.018m). Ring foot, plumb ovoid body, concave wide neck; neck and part of shoulder broken. Decoration: bands, wavy vertical line on handles—Covering its mouth: *sherd*, coarse ware—Inside the amphora: *bones* of “small child” • *carbonised remains* (food offerings?)—Over the urn: two *stone slabs* • small *pile of stones* containing pottery sherds, P 4612—Late Geometric

2 G 12 : 2 (Grave 2)

Disturbed (destroyed by later pit)—Mass of sherds and remains of a young child’s skeleton. According to Young, the sherds belong to the funerary vessel of the disturbed burial and its associated offerings: *Neck-amphora*, wheelmade, P 4603 (H. pres. 0.445m, Diam. lip 0.23m). Ovoid body, narrow neck. Decoration: bands—Offerings: 4 *Phaleron cups* P 4604-4607 (H. 0.047-0.05m) • *skyphos*, P 6470 (H. 0.068m) • *kantharos*, P 4608 (H. to lip 0.065, H. w. handle 0.095m, Diam. at lip 0.09m) • *oinochoe*, P 4763 • (H. to lip 0.12m, H. to handle 0.137m, Diam. 0.098m) • *pitcher*, coarse ware, P 4770 (H. 0.185m)—Among the sherds: remains of another wheelmade *amphora*, P 6463—Late Geometric

3 G 12: 3 (Grave 3)

Partly destroyed by later well (funerary vase cut off just below the neck by the well). Inside the grave, set on its side; *Neck-amphora*, wheelmade, P 4609a (H. 0.24m, Diam. rim 0.223m). Ovoid body, narrow concave neck. Decoration: on neck, vertical line rising from box filled with St. Andrews cross; bands on body; St. Andrews cross on handles—Covering its mouth: *amphora* base, P 4609b (Diam. foot 0.16m)—On neck, as lid: *amphora* base, P 4610 (Diam. foot 0.13m)—Inside the grave fill, standing upright beside the amphora’s neck: *pitcher*, coarse ware, P 4610 (H. 0.205m, Diam. max. 0.165m), sealed with *flat stone*—Late Geometric

4 G 12: 14 (Grave 3) (Fig. 1)

Inside the grave, set on its side: *Pithos*, coarse ware, P 4960 (H. 0.885m, Diam. max. 0.60m, Diam. mouth 0.338m). Concave neck, ovoid body, flat base. Undecorated (**Fig. 7**)—Covering its mouth: *stone slab*—Inside the pithos: skeletons of 2 young children • *Phaleron cup*, P 4963 (H. 0.052m, Diam. rim 0.08m) • *Phaleron cup*, P 4964 (H. 0.05m) • *Phaleron cup*, P 4965 (H. 0.039m, Diam. rim 0.069m) • *Phaleron cup*, P 4966 (H. 0.044m, Diam. rim 0.066m) • *Phaleron cup*, P 4967 (H. 0.054m, Diam. rim 0.079m) • *Phaleron cup*, P 4968 (H. 0.043m, Diam. rim 0.076m); *oinochoe*, P 4969 (H. at lip 0.052m, w. handle 0.069m), Diam. 0.05m) • *oinochoe*, P 4970 (H. at lip 0.09m, w. handle 0.101m, Diam. 0.076m); *oinochoe*, P 4971 (H. 0.08m, Diam. 0.08m) • *oinochoe*, P 4972 (H. 0.077m, Diam. 0.057m) • *kantharos*, P 4973 (H. at lip 0.06m, w. handles 0.08m, Diam. 0.09m); *kantharos*, P 4974 (H. at lip 0.031m, w. handles 0.044m, Diam. 0.06m) • *bronze ring*, B 202 (Diam. 0.024m)—Inside the pit filling, in front of the stone slab, standing upright: *pitcher*, coarse ware P 4962 (H. 0.225, Diam. max. 0.182)—Inside the pit fill, under the pitcher: *animal bone*—Beside the pithos: *kantharos*, P 4961 (W) (H. at lip 0.065m, w. handle 0.083m, Diam. 0.096m) • *oinochoe*, P 4975 (H. 0.088m, Diam. 0.065m), placed inside a: • *kantharos*, P 4976 (H. at lip 0.064m, w. handle 0.09m, Diam. 0.093m) • *oinochoe*, P 4977 (H. 0.152m)—All vessels apart from the coarse pitcher decorated with geometric motifs (**Fig. 8**)—Late Geometric

Young 1939, 36-41 (Grave IX), fig. 22 (grave) figs 23-25, 73; Brann 1962, 127-128.

5 G 12: 16 (Grave 15) (Fig. 2)

Inside the grave, set on its side: *Hydria*, wheelmade, P 4980 (H. 0.495m, Diam. 0.334m). Ring foot, ovoid body, narrow neck. Decoration: “Banded”, diagonal fringes and arrow below the base of the neck which is covered in black glaze; St. Andrews cross on handle (**Fig. 6**)—Covering its mouth: *one-handled cup*, P 4982 (H. 0.063m, Diam. max. 0.104m). Glazed; bars on handle—Beside its neck, standing upright: *pitcher*, coarse ware P 4981 (H. 0.187, Diam. max. 0.18)—Inside the hydria: skeleton of infant with knees doubled up close to its chest, skull at the shoulder of the hydria • *spherical pot of pink clay* (small)—Late Geometric

Young 1939, 32-44 (Grave X), figs 27-28; Brann 1962, 128.

6 G 12: 5 (Grave 5)

Partially disturbed by later well. Set on its side, with mouth tw. S: *Hydria*, wheelmade, P 4614 (H. 0.345m, Diam. 0.305m). High ring foot, plumb ovoid body, horizontal loop handles. Decoration: “Banded”, added vertical strokes at the base of the neck; wavy line in handle zone; glazed foot and upper surface of handles—Inside the amphora: *skeleton* of “small child”, knees drawn to chest • *cup*, P 4616 (H. 0.055m; Diam. at rim 0.075m). Glaze bands below and on outer edge of lip, also on

handles; vertical strokes in handle zone • *skyphos*, P 4615 (H. 0.068m, Diam. rim 0.109m). Glazed inside, on upper surface of handles and lower body; vertical lines on lip, zigzag lines in handle zones—Late Geometric/early 7th c. BC

7 G 12: 10 (Grave 9) (Fig. 3)

Partially disturbed by later grave. Set on its side with mouth tw. N: *Neck-amphora*, wheelmade, P 4768 (H. 0.71m, Diam. 0.45m). Ring foot, ovoid body, concave neck. Decoration: double triangle enclosing St. Andrews cross on neck, flanked by wavy vertical lines; streaky red/black glaze on body (**Fig. 5**)—Covering its mouth: *Plate*, P 4767 (H. 0.041m, Diam. rim 0.183m). Geometric decoration (petalled-flowers, petals, bands, dots)—Inside the amphora: *bones* of “small child”—Inside the grave fill, under the neck of the amphora: *cup*, P 4786 (H. 0.055, Diam. rim 0.071) • *oinochoe*, P 4785 (H. 0.122m, Diam. max. 0.074m). Both with Geometric decoration on the outside • *pitcher*, coarse ware P 4769 (H. 0.165m, Diam. max. 0.137m). Front side blackened—Latest 8th or early 7th c. BC.

8 F 12: 1 (Grave 18)

Disturbed shallow round pit cut in the bedrock, all finds together in the disturbed pit : *Spouted basin* fragment, coarse ware, P 6482 (H. 0.238m, Diam. rim ca. 0.43m). Undecorated—On the fragment: *skull* and *bones* of infant. Offerings: *oinochoe*, P 5347 (H. 0.099m, Diam. max. 0.085m). Black glazed with reserved band occupied by fine glaze lines—First half of the 7th c. BC

9 G 12: 18 (Grave 17) (Fig. 4)

Shallow pit in the bedrock, partially destroyed by later drain. Inside the pit, set on its side:

Amphora, coarse ware, P 5080 (H. pres. 0.47m, H. rest. 0.565m, Diam. max. 0.35m). Ovoid body, short neck, rounded lip. Undecorated—Covering its mouth: *vessel fragment*, coarse—Inside the amphora: skeleton of infant or young child, carbonised matter and cinders—Sixth c. BC

Young 1939, 21, fig. 7 (amphora) (Grave I).

10 G 12: 1 (Grave 1)

Partially disturbed by Pit A. Inside the grave: *Amphora*, wheelmade, P4599 (H. 0.595m, Diam. max. 0.395m, Diam. lip 0.176m, Diam. base 0.152m). Flaring ring foot, ovoid body. Reddish-brown glaze except for neck, handles and lower edge of foot; incised lines on handle zone—Covering its mouth: *flat stone*—Inside the amphora: *bones* of “small child” • *skyphos/kotyle*, P 4600 (H. 0.049m, Diam. lip 0.067m, Diam. base 0.034m). Attic imitation of Corinthian depicting waterbird and siren • *lidded pyxis*, P 4602 (Pyxis: H. 0.052m, Diam. lip 0.072, Lid: H. w. knob 0.039m; Diam. 0.076m). Body

covered with Geometric motifs; procession of water birds on lid • *oinochoe*, P 4601 (H. 0.078m, Max. diam. 0.056m). Siren facing water fowl on body; rosettes and purple band—Sixth c. BC (early)

“Archaic cemetery” (Industrial District) (Plan 2)

11 B 21: 10 (Grave XV) (Fig. 9)

Disturbed (funerary vessel preserved from below the shoulder to just above the foot). Set on its side, with mouth tw. S: *Neck-amphora* fragment, wheelmade, P 15838 (H. pres. 0.40m). Foot cut off prior to funerary use and opening subsequently covered with two stones. Decoration: bands on upper body; black glaze above foot—On the fragment: *skull* and some *bones* of infant ca. 18 months old—Late Geometric

12 B 21: 11 (Grave XVI)

Partly destroyed by Grave XV (upper part of the burial vessel missing). Set on its side: *Amphora*, coarse ware, P 15454 (H. pres. 0.81m, Diam. max. 0.52m). Ring foot, plumb ovoid body. Large opening on shoulder prior to funerary use—Inside the amphora: *bones* of young child—Offering: *pyxis*, Corinthian—Probably first half of the 6th c. BC

Northwest foot of the Areopagus hill

13 D 16: 3 (Grave 2)

Roughly rectangular pit (1.30m x 1.00m x 0.70-1.05m), floor shaped in conformity with the burial urn. Inside the pit, set on its side, with mouth tw. E: *Pithos*, coarse ware, P 20088 (H. 0.80m, Diam., max 0.52m, Diam. mouth 0.33m, Diam. base 0.10m). Stump-like base, bulging body, flaring rim. Undecorated (Fig. 10b)—Covering its mouth: square *stone slab* (Fig. 10c)—Beside the pithos, standing upright: *pitcher*, coarse ware, P 20087 (H. 0.22m, Diam. 0.195m). Smoke-blackened from use (Fig. 10a)—Inside the pithos: skeleton of 10 (Thompson) or 16-month-old individual (Immerwahr) • *juglet*, P 20079 (H. 0.063m; Diam. 0.058m) • *squat aryballos*, P 20080 (H. 0.059m) • *skyphos*, P 20081 (H. 0.04m) • *kantharos*, P 20082 (H. to lip 0.042m, w. handle 0.055m, Diam at lip 0.064m) • *skyphos*, P 20083 (H. 0.075m) • *bowl with rolled handles*, P 20084 (H. 0.045m) • *high-rimmed skyphos*, P 20085 (H. 0.08m) • *jug*, P 20086 (H. 0.175m). All with typical LG decoration (Fig. 11)—Late Geometric (ca. 725 BC)

Industrial District

14 B 19: 4 (SE room of House C, no grave no)

Largely destroyed (only part of one side of the funerary vessel preserved). Set on its side, with mouth tw. N: *Amphora*, wheelmade P 18412 (H. pres. 0.56m). Decoration: on neck, double triangle enclosing St. Andrew's cross flanked by vertical zigzags; glazed shoulder and just above foot—Inside the remains of the amphora and in the grave fill: few fragments of *bones* of child (including skull and finger bones)—Late Geometric

15 Tomb C 19: 1 (House 0, Tomb 51) (Fig. 12)

Pit cut in the bedrock (0.95m x 0.55m, Depth 0.65m). Inside the pit, set on its side, mouth tw. S.: *Pithos*, coarse ware, P 19737 (H. 0.805m, Diam. rim 0.389m). Part of shoulder and rim at one side missing. Flat narrow base, ovoid body, flaring rim. Undecorated—Inside the pithos: *skull* and *leg-bones* of “small child”, doubled-up position, with head tw. mouth of the pithos—Probably 6th or 7th c BC.

16 G 12: 26 (Fig. 13)

Shallow pit in the bedrock. Set on its side, with mouth tw. W. (much of the upper half washed out): *Pithos*, coarse ware, B 2226. Decoration: incised—Inside the pithos: fragmentary base of *oinochoe* or *kados*, coarse ware, B 2227, covering infant *bones* and *skull*—Inside the pit: *clay disk*, cut from body of wheelmade closed vessel, B 2228 • handle fragment of *cooking pot*, coarse ware B 2229. Incised decoration—Ca. 700 BC

“Middle Stoa”

17 I 13: 5

Deposit of broken pottery found in shallow depression in bedrock containing: *Neck-amphora*, wheelmade, P 32887 (H. 0.88m, Diam. rim 0.32m; Diam. 0.50m). High ring foot, ovoid body, out-turned rim. Decoration: on neck, between panels, horizontal series of lozenges, panels with spoked circles; body covered by glazed bands; lip, shoulder, lower body, and foot glazed; bands framing an “X”, 3 vertical lines flanked by a wavy one on handles (Fig. 14)—Enchytrismos reported as belonging to 5-year-old individual—Possible offerings or intrusions to the burial: *Phaleron cup*, P 32882 (H. 0.04m, Diam. max. 0.08m). Glazed • *aryballos*, P 32884 (H. 0.05m, Diam. 0.035m). Thin glaze bands—Late Geometric

18 Tomb Q 17: 6 (no grave no)

Set on its side: *Pithos* fragments, coarse ware, P 25787 (H. neck pres. 0.102m, H. body pres. 0.345m, Diam. rim 0.195m). Everted flat rim, ovoid body, stand (partly broken). Decoration: incised wavy lines, strokes, straight double lines enclosing dots, zigzags—Covering its mouth: *bowl base*, P 25788 (H. pres. 0.14m, Diam. foot 0.11m). Glazed lower bottom and bands above—Inside the pithos: one month old individual—Inside the grave fill: *oinochoe*, P 25790 (H. 0.095m, Diam. 0.073m). Glazed with reserved lines at base of handle; vertical bands on handle • *juglet*, P 25791 (H. 0.085m, Diam. max. 0.073m). Glazed with reserved lines at base of handle; wavy line on handle • *skyphos*, P 25792 (H. 0.06m, Diam. max. 0.10m). Glazed except under handles • *cup*, Protoattic, P 25789 (H. 0.045m, Diam. max. 0.062m). Glaze bands and lozenges; panel with ladder framed by vertical lines on handle—Late Geometric

19 Tomb M 18: 6

Disturbed by later well (lower part of the funerary vessel cut-off). Set on its side, mouth tw. NE: *Pithos*, wheelmade, P 8922 (H. pres 0.60m, Diam.shoulder 0.50m). Ovoid body, short neck, heavy projecting rim. Decoration: double moulded ridges at base of neck, below the shoulder and around the lower body; glazed with reserved rim (**Fig. 15a**)—Inside the pithos: *bones* and *skull* of child • *black-figure lekythos*, P 8918 (H. 0.133m). Draped standing figures (**Fig. 15b**) • *eye skyphos*, P 8919 (H. 0.07m) (**Fig. 15c**) • *plate*, P 8921 (H. 0.018m). Alternating black glazed and reserved bands ext.; black glaze with reserved band int. (**Fig. 15b**) • miniature *bowl*, P 8920 (H. 0.032m). Unglazed ext.; black glazed int.—Sixth c. BC (last quarter)

Acropolis, South Slope (Plan 3)

20 Tomb I (19)

Set on its side, neck retained by stones on either side, mouth tw. N: *Neck-Amphora*, wheelmade, ΓM 1 (H. 0.595m, Diam. base 0.152m, Diam. max. 0.395m, Diam. lip 0.206m). Parts of body and base missing. Ring foot, ovoid body, rounded lip. Decoration: on neck, horses at the manger; on shoulder, bands of hatched triangles and continuous lozenges; thin bands on body; broad glaze band on lower body (**Fig. 20**)—Covering its mouth: *plate*, ΓM 2 (H. 0.035m, Diam. lip 0.19m). Large lanciform

leaves running around its base—Inside the amphora: *bones* and *skull* fragments of “infant”—Offerings (positioning unknown): *cup*, ΓΜ 3 (H. 0.052m, Diam. base 0.034m, Diam. lip 0.073m). Zigzags on shoulder zone; bands on body • *oinochoe*, ΓΜ 4 (H 0.125m, Diam. base 0.05m, Diam. max. 0.075m). Geometric motifs and water birds on neck • *oinochoe*, ΓΜ 5 (H. 0.065m, Diam. base, Diam. max. 0.049m). Faded geometric decoration • *juglet, handmade* ΓΜ 6. Argive monochrome—Late Geometric
Charitonidis 1973, 6-7, pls 1-2.

21 Tomb II (20)

Set on its side, retained by stones placed under handles/shoulder/base, with mouth tw. SE, side of the body facing upwards missing: *Neck-amphora*, wheelmade, ΓΜ 7. (H. 0.677m, Diam. max. 0.395m, Diam. lip 0.21m). Ring foot, ovoid body, rounded lip. Decoration: glazed lip; on neck, wheel enclosing St. Andrew’s cross flanked by vertical lines; glazed body with reserved bands (**Fig. 17**)—Covering its mouth: *stone*—Inside the amphora: few tiny *bones* of “infant”—Offerings (positioning unknown): *oinochoe*, ΓΜ 8 (H 0.092m, Diam. base 0.054m, Diam. max. 0.068m). Glazed neck and lower body; geometric decoration on body • *pitcher* (lower body fragment), coarse ware ΓΜ 9 (H. max. 0.18, Diam. base 0.075m, Diam. max. 0.175m) • *plate*, ΓΜ 10 (H 0.032m, Diam. base 0.065m, Diam. lip 0.195m) • *juglet*, coarse ware, ΓΜ 11 (H. 0.08m, Diam. max. 0.07m, lip 0.025m)—Late Geometric
Charitonidis 1973, 7-8, pl. 3.

22 Tomb III (21)

Inside pit cut in the bedrock, mouth tw. SE: *Neck-Amphora*, wheelmade, ΓΜ 12 (H. 0.69m, Diam. base 0.14m, Diam. max. 0.44m, Diam. lip 0.255m). Ring foot, tall ovoid body, rounded lip. Decoration: on neck, double triangle framed by wheels on either side; glazed body—No mention of bones, yet reported as “infant” burial—Offerings (positioning unknown): *pitcher*, coarse ware, ΓΜ 13 (H. 0.211m, Diam. base 0.065m, Diam. max. 0.155m, Diam. lip 0.134m) • *oinochoe*, ΓΜ 14 (H 0.135m, Diam. base 0.045m, Diam. max. 0.075m). Geometric decoration • *oinochoe*, ΓΜ 15 (H. 0.092m, Diam. base 0.049m, Diam. max. 0.065m). Geometric decoration • *juglet*, handmade, ΓΜ 16 (H. 0.08m, Diam. base 0.071m, Diam. lip 0.027m). Argive monochrome • *skyphos*, ΓΜ 17 (H. 0.035m, Diam. base 0.031m, Diam. lip. 0.06m). Glazed lower body, zigzags between handles, bands on upper body • *Phaleron cup*, ΓΜ 18 (H. 0.0435m, Diam. base 0.035m, Diam. lip 0.078m) • *Phaleron cup*, ΓΜ 19 (H. 0.046m, Diam. base 0.041m, Diam. lip 0.08m) • *Phaleron cup*, ΓΜ 20 (H. 0.045m, Diam. base 0.04m, Diam. lip 0.081m) • *Phaleron cup*, ΓΜ 21 (H. 0.04m, Diam. base 0.036m, Diam. lip 0.08m). All cups decorated with bands, wavy and straight lines, blobs (**Fig. 21**)—Late Geometric.

23 Tomb IV (A)

Inside pit (0.70m x 0.38-46m): *Amphora* fragment (body), wheelmade, ΓΜ 22 (H. max. 0.43m, Max. width 0.325m). Glazed—Inside the fragment: “child” bones—Late Geometric
Charitonidis 1973, 10, pl. 5ε (amphora fragment).

24 Tomb V (B)

Pit (L. 0.53m). Same as above and of similar state of preservation (No further information)—Late Geometric
Charitonidis 1973, 11.

25 Tomb VIII (23)

Disturbed. *Amphora*, wheelmade, (ΓΜ 25), Athens NAK 479 (H. 1.035m, Diam. base 0.22m, Diam. max. 0.62m, Diam. lip 0.342m). Ring foot, ovoid body, rounded lip. Decoration: on neck, two narrow panels each enclosing a warrior holding a round shield, spear and wearing a helmet, bird between his legs; glazed shoulder; bands on body; glazed foot (**Fig. 19**)—Late Geometric.

26 Tomb XI (17)

Oriented E-W: *Pithos*, coarse ware, ΓΜ 27 (H. 0.43, Diam. base 0.15, Diam. max. 0.29, Diam. lip 0.22). Parts of belly, neck and lip missing. Ovoid body, high flaring foot. Decoration: on neck, wavy lines; incised fishbone bordered by wavy lines; mastoid protrusions with incised upright wavy lines climbing up to the lip—Covering its mouth: *stone plaque*—Offerings (one object found inside the grave fill, close to the base of the pithos, the others inside the pithos): *skyphos*, ΓΜ 9 (H. 0.049m, Diam. base 0.039m, Diam. lip int. 0.084m) • *oinochoe*, ΓΜ30 (H. 0.111m, Diam. base 0.052m, Diam. max. 0.075, Diam. lip 0.045m) • *skyphos fragment*, ΓΜ 31 (H. 0.057m, Diam. base 0.0455m, W. max. 0.084m)—Late Geometric
